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PTE:

The Pearson Test of English (PTE) is an English language test designed to assess non-native English speakers' readiness to participate in a university-level English language instruction program and for immigration purposes.

- Founded in 2009 under the PLC as a test for non native English Speakers is widely gaining acceptance across the globe as the gold standard for assessing individuals for immigration, residential or academic purposes.
- This rapidly increasing worldwide popularity is due to the fact that the PTE is completely computer based with minimal human intervention.
- PTE is the first entirely computer-based, powered by AI technology, PTE Academic provides a fast and convenient testing solution without human bias.
- PTE is more accurate way of testing non-native English language students who enter the English-speaking world.
- PTE Academic is designed to test your English reading, writing, listening and speaking skills.
- There are three timed parts:
 - 1. Speaking and writing
 - 2. Reading
 - 3. Listening
- Each part may contain a number of sections. Each section is individually timed.
- The test takes approximately two hours to complete including an un-timed introduction to the test in the beginning.


About PTE:


- The test assesses an individual's communicative skills through questions using authentically-sourced material and in addition provides feedback on enabling skills.

- **Test Taker ID:** The ID generated at the time of creating the account with Pearson. It will remain same for your every test booking.
- Country of Citizenship: Which country's citizenship the test-taker holds
- Country of Residence: Which country the test-taker is residing in
- Gender: The gender of the test-taker
- Email address: The email address provided by the test-taker at the time of booking the test
- **Registration ID:** The ID generated when you book a date for the PTE test. It will be unique for each test.
- Test Date: The date on which the test was taken
- Test Centre Country: The country in which the test was taken
- Test Centre ID: The identification number of the test centre
- First-time test taker: Shows whether the test-taker had taken the PTE for the first time
- Report Issue Date: The date on which the scorecard was issued
- Scores Valid Until: The validity of the PTE score card is of two years from the date of test

PTE Academic Score:

Overall Score:

- Ranges between 10 and 90 points
- 70-91 items from 20 different types, for each item, the score will affect the rest of the items and thus, an overall score.

Communicative skill scores:

- Speaking, writing, listening, and reading.
- Though, each module's item belongs to the major category, it also tests the other skill.
- Each of the communicative skills scores ranges from 10 to 90 points.
- The graph in the report card will make you understand the different criteria along with their scores to reflect candidate's weakness and strength in English.

Enabling skill scores:

- Assess the performance of the test-taker in the productive skills of writing and speaking.
- The enabling skills are classified in grammar, oral fluency, pronunciation, spelling, vocabulary, and written discourse.
- These skills also range from 10-90.

PTE Academic Score:

Global Scale of English

- The Global Scale of English (GSE) is internationally accepted scale to evaluate your skills for the language of English.
- PTE Academic score, along with other popular English tests such as IELTS and TOEFL, can be mentioned on the GSE.

Concordance methodology: (Updated by Pearson's on 01.12.2020)

- In the mid-range -> the updated concordant scores have been minimally adjusted (the test is typically used for academic admissions purposes)
- •At IELTS 7.5 and above, the concordant PTE Academic scores are at some points higher on the scale.
- •At IELTS 6.5 and below the concordant PTE Academic scores are at some points lower on the scale

Pearson has recently tried to clarify the confusion amidst the candidates due to its recent concordance report.

PTE exam pattern or scoring has not changed – It may change in the future but everyone will be notified with ample time for preparation.

How is PTE Scored:

All items in PTE Academic are **100% machine scored** using PTE Academic's automated scoring system.

There are two types of scoring – correct or incorrect and partial scoring.

Correct or Incorrect:

- If responses are **correct**, a score of 1 score point will be given, but if they are **incorrect**, no score points are awarded.
- Scores for some item types are based on correctness alone.

Partial Credit :

- Few tasks are scored as correct, partially correct or incorrect.
- If responses to these items are correct, the maximum score points available for each item type will be received, but if they are partly correct, some score points will be given, but less than the maximum available for the item type.
- If responses are incorrect, no score points will be received.
- The quality of the response is represented in the enabling skills.

- Partial Credit: 15
